Visiting Professor – Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter School of Public Policy

The Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter School of Public Policy at the Georgia Institute of Technology invites applications for a non-tenure-track Visiting Professor position, open rank, beginning no later than August 15, 2026. The position is for the 2026-2027 academic year, with the possibility of renewal for a second year. The successful candidate will also be affiliated with Georgia Tech's Institute for Technology and Civic Leadership.

The position will contribute to teaching and intellectual leadership at the intersection of technology, ethics, law, public policy, and civic life, supporting interdisciplinary education and scholarship on the societal impacts and governance of emerging technologies, including artificial intelligence.

The successful candidate will be expected to teach AI Ethics and Policy and should be prepared to teach one or more of the following courses or related subjects: American Constitutional Issues, Judicial Process, Political Philosophy, Politics and Policy, Biomedical Ethics, or Law, Medicine, and Ethics. Additional teaching interests that complement the Carter School's strengths are welcome.

The teaching load will be 2 courses per semester (or equivalent, subject to School needs and appointment terms). The successful candidate will be expected to be an effective and engaged teacher, contribute to student mentoring, and participate in the intellectual life of the Carter School.

Required Qualifications

Applicants must possess a Ph.D., J.D., or other appropriate terminal degree in philosophy, law, political science, public policy, bioethics, or a closely related field by the start of the appointment.

Application Materials

Applicants should submit a cover letter, a current curriculum vitae, and a teaching statement (including evidence of teaching effectiveness, if available)

Applications will be reviewed beginning immediately and will continue until the position is filled.
